There is still time before the end of the year to contribute to our special 10-week fundraising campaign to raise \$10,000 to support our Oral History program. We selected \$10,000 as our target amount in order to match the \$10,000 raised by the Friends of the PCMC during the Silent Auction at the Panama Canal Society Reunion in July and also because we are celebrating the 10th anniversary of the PCMC at UF. Thanks to everyone who has already contributed to the 10-week campaign. We will report on the results of the campaign in January.

We kicked off the 10-week campaign on October 10th with a special curator talk webinar in which PCMC curators John Nemmers and Betsy Bemis shared excerpts from oral history interviews, presented recent and upcoming exhibitions, and discussed PCMC acquisitions and highlights from the past decade. We also are spotlighting our oral history interviews throughout this 10-week campaign with a series of special "10 For 10" posts on the PCMC Blog. Associate Curator Betsy Bemis has selected brief excerpts from ten interviews which feature memories of life in the Canal Zone and Panama from various interview participants. Each post includes a short interview clip along with a transcript and one or more images relating to the topics covered in the clips. We have received some terrific feedback on the posts, which are released weekly.

All funds raised during this end-of-year campaign will be contributed towards our <u>Oral History Campaign</u>, so that we can continue to conduct interviews and share them globally in our digital collection. We are happy to report that as of November 15th, we have raised just over \$150,000 in our Oral History Campaign, which began in Spring 2020.
