Special Blog Posts

This week, we published the final post in a <u>special series of posts on the PCMC Blog</u> focusing on the important work of both the Panama Canal Museum and the Friends of

the PCMC in building the collection and developing our oral history program. As mentioned previously, this year is the 25th anniversary of the founding of the Panama Canal Museum in 1998. The museum operated for 14 years in Seminole, Florida, before closing in 2012 and transferring its collection to UF. The successes achieved by the museum paved the way for the PCMC to develop as a preeminent research collection. Many of the museum's leaders, volunteers, and supporters have continued to be actively involved with the collection and provide guidance as members of our Friends group, and we're thrilled with all that we have accomplished together.

The final post in the series, <u>Lessons with Lucho</u>, highlights the importance of the museum and the Friends group in developing the collection and also the importance of oral histories and personal memories in documenting the American era of the Canal. The post includes images of Lucho Azcarraga and his album covers that the museum began collecting years ago, and also a clip from an oral history interview with Don Randel and excerpts from the memoirs of our Friends Frank Baldwin, Frank Townsend, and Sydney Townsend Corbett.

We take the same approach of combining historical objects with personal stories in our exhibitions in the Nahmad Panama Canal Gallery and in the teaching that we do here at UF and other places. We always like to acknowledge that this approach and these activities are simply a continuation of the good work started by the museum 25 years ago. We hope that you have enjoyed the posts!





Yes, We Are Always Collecting

We are asked frequently what types of materials we collect, and some people even want to know whether or not we collect anything at all. Rest assured, we are constantly acquiring important historical objects, everything from family photos and letters to artifacts and memorabilia. In fact, the collection is always growing at a healthy rate and the large majority of our acquisitions are gifts rather than purchases. We are regularly contacted by family members and friends who have inherited materials from deceased loved ones who aren't sure if we would be interested in anything. Yes, we definitely want those treasures. No, we do not accept everything offered to us. Our main reason for declining gifts is that we already have the items (e.g., this is particularly true of books and periodicals). Here are some of our "most wanted" items that we collect:

- Diaries, journals, memoirs, firsthand accounts, oral histories, and other types of personal narratives that offer unique perspectives and stories.
- Correspondence such as letters, telegrams, and postcards.
- Home movies, films, and audio or video recordings.
- Photographs in all formats and types: prints, slides, negatives, aerial photos, panoramic, stereographs, etc.
- Scrapbooks. In general, we do not collect scrapbooks full of newspaper clippings. Please do not assemble archival materials into a scrapbook before donating.
- Ephemera such as brochures, pamphlets, programs, menus, and travel guides.
 We already have a lot of these in the PCMC and we do not collect duplicates normally, but we do want to collect ephemera that we have not already preserved.

Our Collection Committee will consider anything offered to us, so don't hesitate to contact us even if your items aren't included on this list. For many of the objects listed above, we do accept digital reproductions if donors are not willing to donate the original objects.
