Thanks again to all of our terrific supporters who contributed during our Fall fundraising campaign. Our goal was to raise \$12,000 to support our Oral History program, and we are happy to report that we raised \$18,880 between October and December. When combined with the \$13,000 raised by the Friends' 2023 Silent Auction, we raised a grand total of almost \$32,000!

A special thank you to Albert and Jane Nahmad, who donated \$10,000 for the Fall campaign. The Nahmad family had previously provided funding that helped establish the Nahmad Panama Canal Gallery at UF, which opened in 2017 and is dedicated to Al Nahmad's classmates in the Balboa High School Class of 1958. The family has continued to provide support for our exhibits program over the years, so it is very generous for Al and Jane to also support the Oral History Program in this way. Another special thank you to the Sprague Family, who surprised us by selecting the PCMC as one of their Charity Partners for their annual Sprague Family Give Back through Art program. As a result of their generosity, we received \$1,400 for the oral history campaign. New Exhibition Opens at Spring Luncheon April 2024

The 2024 exhibition in the Albert H. Nahmad Panama Canal Gallery will examine the history of the railroad in Panama. In addition to focusing on the construction of the first transcontinental railroad in the 1850s, the exhibition will address how people

crossed the isthmus prior to the railroad, particularly during the Gold Rush years. Other topics include the creation and development of railroad stations and towns; special cars and trains; the steamship line; the impacts of Canal construction on the railroad; management of the commissaries used throughout the Canal Zone; and the various ways in which employees, residents, and tourists used or interacted with the railroad for decades. The exhibition will open to the public on April 6 during the Panama Canal Society/Friends of the PCMC Spring Luncheon at Smathers Library on the University of Florida campus in Gainesville. 
